It is an institution or a set of institutions which have been invested with a legitimate monopoly over the means of physical violence to exercise authority over both its territory and the population resident therein. Furthermore it is also in control of the monopoly of taxation as well as the monopoly of setting and enforcing rules and regulations that are binding for every citizen (Lambach 2007: 33). Therefore no political authority can exist above it. Usually the state exercises the monopolies by itself or by agents who act on its behalf, but it can also legitimize private acts of violence, taxation or rule setting.
