Method is the medium between teacher and pupil. It is not the question whether the teacher understands the rationale of the processes that concerns the child, but the validity or the falsity of the method employed. Teaching, or the process whereby one mind causes knowledge to arise in another, is an art; the teacher, during the performance of his task, is an artisan; and as such he should know how to use his tools, namely, his methods. 2.
